

PSEG FOUNDATION HELPS US ADD ANOTHER ROBOT!

Earlier this school year, The Phoenix Center submitted a grant to add another robot to our family and our grant was approved by the PSEG Foundation!

On January 8th, the PSEG Foundation came to visit and awarded a \$13,656 grant, allowing us to expand our Robot Human Interaction (RHI) program with the purchase of an additional NAO Robot. The autonomous, programmable humanoid robot is just 23 inches tall and weighs 9.5 pounds. It is equipped with two HD cameras, four microphones, a sonar rangefinder, two infrared emitters and receivers, an inertial board, nine tactile sensors and eight pressure sensors. More than the sum of its parts, the NAO robot acts as a mediator to encourage students with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) to explore their interactions with other people in a way that is non-threatening.

Maria Spina, Program Officer and Marlene Perfeito from PSEG Foundation, Scott Kennedy from The Montclair Dispatch and Emily Girsch from FIOS TV were on hand to interact with NAO. Our student, Billy, has developed a software program for the robot to do a "Simon Says" interactive learning module for another classroom. When asked why he likes to work with the younger students, his response was, "because I like to be a good friend." Billy's mom, Jen, was able to contribute great insights as well.

The PSEG Foundation's generosity allowed The Phoenix Center to purchase its first NAO in 2016. We are so thankful to add another NAO Robot to our growing family.

Great news travels fast—in addition to the FiOS news piece, News Channel 12 also featured our Robot Human Interactive program!
